GETTING HERE

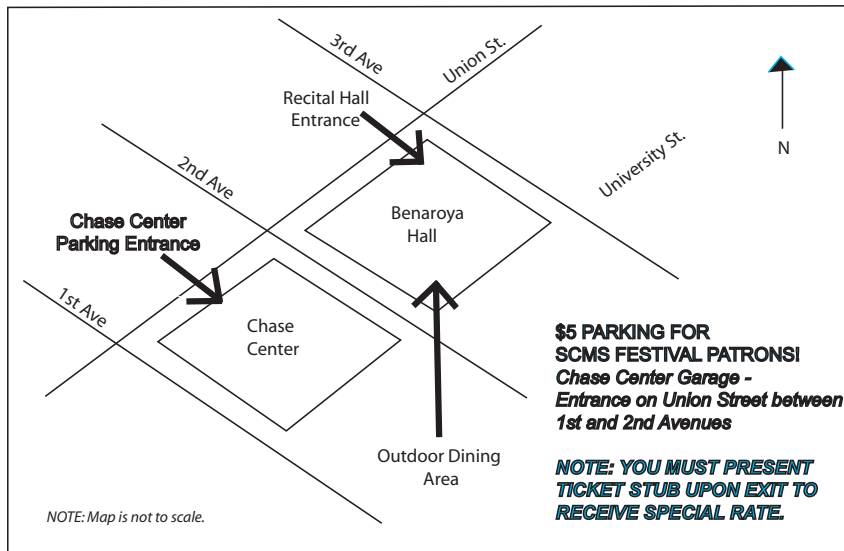
Benaroya Hall is centrally located at 200 University Street in downtown Seattle and easy to reach by car and/or public transportation. For example, North End patrons can drive to the Northgate Park-and-Ride and take the #16 or #66 bus directly to the hall. For additional bus route information, contact Metro at www.metronkingcounty.gov or (206) 553-3000. For Community Transit, call (425) 353-RIDE or 1.800.562.1375. For Sound Transit, call 1.888.889.6368 or visit www.soundtransit.org The revamped Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel has a bus and light rail stop just below the hall.

PLAN AHEAD

Expect general traffic congestion on the following dates, as Mariners home games start at 7:05 PM: July 5, July 7, July 9, July 23, and July 24. There will be other events taking place in the same building as our Festival on July 7 and 9. Please allow extra time if you are attending concerts on any of these dates.

PARKING

Festival patrons can take advantage of a special \$5 per evening rate at the Chase Center garage. PLEASE NOTE: Parking attendant will collect your ticket stub when you exit the garage. Parking is also available most nights in the Benaroya Hall garage; rates will vary. Disabled parking is available in both garages.

DINING

You can pre-order an elegant picnic dinner prepared by Wolfgang Puck Catering and enjoy dining *al fresco*! To order online, go to www.seattlechambermusic.org/concerts/dining.php The Garden of Remembrance, located along Second Avenue on the west side of Benaroya Hall, will be transformed into a comfortable and safe outdoor dining space, exclusively for our Festival. Or feel free to bring your own picnic if you choose. PLEASE NOTE: Alcohol must be purchased onsite and consumed only in designated areas.

IN THE HALL

Concerts and recitals take place in Nordstrom Recital Hall on the second floor of the Benaroya Hall building. The closest entrance to the hall from the street is at the corner of Third and Union. Our box office table is located at the top of the staircase, separate from the Benaroya Hall ticket window on the main floor. Directional signage for our Festival will be clearly displayed throughout the hall and on the grounds, and all areas are fully ADA accessible.

8:00 PM	Main concert begins

PRE-CONCERT RECITALS

Each main-series concert is preceded by a pre-concert recital, lasting approximately 30 minutes. These concerts are free and open to the public with general admission seating; tickets are not required. Recitals begin promptly at 7 PM, and there is no late seating. At the conclusion of the recital, the hall is cleared in preparation for the 8 PM concert, for which a ticket is required.

“MUSIC UNDER THE STARS”

Our free-admission “Music Under the Stars” program offers live audio broadcasts of all our concerts and recitals outdoors into the Garden of Remembrance. This is a great way to experience world-class chamber music in a more informal setting on the evenings for which you don’t hold tickets. In addition, live broadcasts of all concerts will be aired on KING-FM 98.1; concerts on July 9, 16, 23, and 28 will be broadcast live at Westlake Park at 8 PM.

LUNCHTIME LECTURES AND OPEN REHEARSALS

Once each week during the Festival, program notes annotator Steven Lowe will give a 30-minute “Educate Your Ear” talk that highlights some of the lesser know works for the upcoming week’s programs.
