Reflecting on Our 38th Season

FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

2019 was our 38th year of bringing the very finest chamber music to Seattle audiences. Musicians come from all over the country and beyond to perform with Artistic Director James Ehnes and with each other, and to play before audiences that recognize and embrace the exceptional quality of their performances.

Our Winter and Summer Festival concerts plus our community outreach through live concert broadcasts on KING-FM, coaching music students in Seattle schools, master classes, competitions for young artists, lectures, recitals, free performances in Seattle parks and more brings our total audience to nearly 25,000 each year.

We're losing our administrative quarters on Queen Anne where our offices have been for over 20 years. The building has been sold and will be torn down. We've leased new space for expanded facilities which is now being renovated, and we'll move in early 2020. Our new home will allow the Society to bring the chamber music experience to more people than ever.

Our Winter and Summer Festival concerts will continue at Benaroya Hall's Nordstrom Recital Hall as before.

Seattle Chamber Music Society remains fiscally sound. The future looks bright.

We are grateful for the musicians and their performances, the staff that makes it all happen and the community that supports us. Thanks to all.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Under the direction of Artistic Director James Ehnes, Seattle Chamber Music Society successfully concludes another exceptional season of great chamber music concerts and extensive community outreach programs, sharing this art form with broad and diverse audiences in the concert hall and beyond. We are proud of our ability to balance high quality artistic programming with sound fiscal oversight. Once again, we ended the fiscal year in the black; in our 38 years we have never carried an accumulated deficit.

Among this season's highlights:

- Stunning musical performances at Winter and Summer Festivals including Janáček's dramatic "Kreutzer" String Quartet No. 1, Sebastian Currier's *Voyage Out* for piano quintet commissioned by the SCMS Commissioning Club, and Brahms' intense Quintet for Piano and Strings, Op. 34.
- The addition of a fifth Seattle park for Music Under the Stars, our free live broadcasts of Summer Festival concerts.
- Our annual *Chamber Music in the Park* concert at Volunteer Park, with thousands of people on the lawn, and dozens of community members joining Festival musicians for a community play-along.
- Master classes by Festival artists; *Open Rehearsals* attended by hundreds of people; and chamber music coaching at four Seattle schools.

THE 2019 SEASON IN REVIEW

OVER 8,800 PATRONS FILLED BENAROYA HALL'S Recital Hall for 18 world-class performances at our *Winter* and *Summer Festival* main series concerts, with capacity averaging 97% and 88% respectively. We welcomed 587 first-time ticket buyers (14% more than last season) and 547 students and young adults (under 30 years of age) to our main Festival concerts.

Under Artistic Director James Ehnes' leadership, we continued to strengthen our artistic distinction at home and abroad, attracting to our

Festivals internationally renowned musicians, creating fresh and dynamic performances that featured both new and returning artists (10 made their debut with us); and reaching millions of listeners through 59 concert broadcasts (17 more than last season) on American Public Media's *Performance Today*, heard on 280 radio stations nationwide.

FREE ACCESS TO MUSIC & EDUCATION

We served over 14,800 people in our community through free and easily accessible education and engagement programs, which shared our Festivals and great chamber music with diverse audiences. Nearly 4,400 people, including 1,500 new audience members, attended our free outdoor live *Chamber Music in the Park* concert and *Music Under the Stars* audio

broadcasts at Seattle public parks. Over 746 music students received free classroom chamber music coaching and free Master Class training sessions. Over 1,900 people experienced more intimate interactions with our artists through free rehearsals and interviews; plus an additional 6,100 people downloaded our *Classical Conversation* podcasts.

WINTER FESTIVAL: JANUARY 18 – 27

Winter Festival turned up the heat in Nordstrom Recital Hall with two weeks of electrifying chamber music performances by 20 stellar musicians. Highlights from the six main concert series included: Beethoven's famous "Ghost" piano trio, Brahms' magnificent Op. 25 Piano Quartet, Janáček's first String Quartet, based on Tolstoy's riveting novella "The Kreutzer Sonata"; an all-French concert featuring masterpieces of Saint-Saëns, Fauré, and Debussy; and Shostakovich's Quintet for Piano and Strings in G minor, with a performance that "*brought forth the huge emotional range of the Shostakovich — and brought down the house, as well.*" (Seattle Times)

SUMMER FESTIVAL: JULY 1 – 26

Summer Festival audiences were treated to an incredible month of great chamber music performed by 42 of the world's finest musicians, including 6 making their SCMS debut. The Festival's 12 main concerts were a celebration of the great range of chamber music from the past five centuries -- from 17th century English songs to string quartets by both Felix and Fanny Mendelssohn, to the US premiere of Enescu's recently rediscovered Piano Trio No. 1, to the season closing performance of one of the greatest masterpieces of all time, Brahms' monumental Piano Quintet in F minor.

COMMISSIONING CLUB

SCMS's Commissioning Club presented the world premiere of its 13th commission, *Voyage Out*, a dramatic new work by American composer Sebastian Currier. The quintet for piano and strings received a standing ovation for its "*impassioned reading from violinists Yura Lee and Jun Iwasaki, violist Jonathan Vinocour, cellist Raphael Bell, and pianist Jeewon Park. Densely scored and rhythmically challenging, this performance often*

sounded like a work for chamber orchestra, not just a quintet." (Seattle Times)

Club members took an in-depth look at Currier's work through three educational salons, and attended a special preview dress rehearsal of the commissioned piece, with the composer Sebastian Currier.

OTHER SPECIAL EVENTS

Opportunities to engage with us more intimately included a special patron trip to Minneapolis in the spring; and three *Crescendo Concert* recital performances in private homes, featuring cellist Edward Arron and pianist Jeewon Park, pianist Max Levinson, and violist Richard O'Neill with pianist Steven Lin.

ENGAGING THE COMMUNITY

Education and Community Engagement Programs help us build connections to our Festival concerts and artists, develop young listeners and performers, and share chamber music with wider and more broadly diverse audiences.

CHAMBER MUSIC IN THE PARK ATTENDEE

CHAMBER MUSIC IN THE PARK

Despite rain earlier in the day, over 2,700 people joined us for our annual *Chamber Music in the Park* at Volunteer Park, Saturday, July 27, at 7pm, for a free live outdoor concert of Kodály's *Duo for Violin and Cello* and Mozart's *Trio for Violin, Viola and Cello*. Before the concert, over 60 community musicians from across our region - including participants from Olympia, Poulsbo, and Everett - joined Artistic Director James Ehnes and four Festival Artists for a *Community Play-Along* performance of Elgar's *Serenade for Strings*.

MUSIC UNDER THE STARS

We grew *Music Under the Stars*, adding a fifth park location for our free outdoor broadcasts of all 12 Summer Festival main concerts. Over 1,660 people joined us for 15 broadcasts (instead of 16 due to heavy rain one evening) at Seattle's Volunteer Park Amphitheater on Capitol Hill, Freeway Park downtown near the Convention Center, Columbia Park in Columbia City, Seattle Chinese Garden in West Seattle, and our newest addition at Yesler Terrace Park on First Hill.

Before each broadcast, audiences were treated to live performances by a variety of talented student ensemble groups, including horns, wind, and string trios and quartets with University of Washington,

Cornish College of the Arts, Seattle Youth Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Music Madness Tuned In! Summer Camp; and two new partners, Redmond and Issaquah high schools. Based on audience survey responses, these broadcasts helped us reach many who were new to us (41%), under 40 years of age (41%), and families with young children (16%).

PRE-CONCERT RECITALS

Free and informal half-hour recitals before each of the 18 main concerts at our *Winter* and *Summer Festivals* attracted 6,560 people, with intimate performances by world-class artists, including many Festival favorites and new faces.

CLASSICAL CONVERSATION

Over 6,100 people world-wide downloaded our free *Classical Conversation* Podcast Series, hosted

by Classical KING-FM's Dave Beck and recorded before a live audience. The in-depth interviews featured Festival artists Scott St. John, Tessa Lark, David Harding, Nicholas Phan, and Erin Keefe.

OPEN REHEARSALS

Average attendance at our *Open Rehearsals* nearly doubled, with approximately 120 people at each of the 7 working rehearsals open for the public to get an inside look at how musicians prepare for concerts.

MUSIC IN THE CLASSROOM ATTENDEE

MEET THE ARTISTS

Through brief, interactive talkbacks following each of our 18 main series **Winter** and **Summer Festivals** concerts, audience members had the opportunity to ask questions of two of the evening’s musicians, and learn first-hand about their personal and artistic lives.

LIVE RADIO BROADCASTS

Over 10,000 listeners in the Puget Sound area and worldwide tuned in each evening to Classical KING-FM to hear live radio broadcasts from Benaroya Hall of all 18 of our **Winter** and **Summer Festival** concerts. Rebroadcasts of 59 different Festival concert highlights were heard on American Public Media’s *Performance Today*, heard by nearly 900,000 people each week and broadcast on 280 stations nationwide throughout the year.

FAMILY CONCERTS

Co-presented with Classical KING-FM 98.1, our Family Concert Series introduced children ages 5-10 to the joys of chamber music. **Winter Festival’s** *Musical Tales*, narrated by KING-FM’s Marta Zekan, charmingly paired popular children’s stories with well-known classical music, arranged for string quartet; and **Summer Festival** took young audiences on a journey through the animal kingdom with Saint-Saëns’ *The Carnival of the Animals*, performed by two Festival pianists, Jeewon Park and Paige Roberts Molloy, and narrated by Children’s Poet Laureate Jack Prelutsky reading his own delightful poems. Before each concert, Classical KING-FM hosted a free hands-on musical instrument “petting zoo”.

PREVIEW LECTURES

Six Preview Lectures by Dr. Julia Tai, Music Director of Philharmonia Northwest and co-Artistic Director of Seattle Modern Orchestra, and by William C. White, Music Director of Orchestra Seattle and lecturer with the Chicago Symphony, introduced upcoming Festival concerts to audiences at University House and Skyline senior facilities. Lectures at the Folio Society library in Pike Place

Market and at Town Hall (featuring Festival musician Angela Drăghicescu) were open to the public.

CHAMBER MUSIC IN THE CLASSROOM

We expanded our free Chamber Music in the Classroom program at public schools to include band (wind instruments) as well as string coaching for middle and high school students. We sent local professional musicians to provide individual/small group coaching to over 630 music students at 4 partnering Seattle Public Schools: Ballard High School, Whitman Middle School, and two new schools — Nathan Hale High School and Denny International Middle School. Musicians also performed live for students.

YOUNG ARTIST AWARD AND MONIKA MEYER CLOWES MEMORIAL AWARD

For the 8th year, SCMS and Classical KING-FM partnered to present the annual *Young Artist Award* competition for young musicians (ages 6-15), and older musicians (ages 16-20), and chamber ensembles (ages 13-23) to highlight the joy of making music with friends. This year there were 68 entries, including 6 chamber ensembles.

SCMS's special *Monika Meyers Clowes Memorial Award* went to Carson Ling-Efird (cello). As part of her prize, this talented young artist received coaching by Festival musicians and performed for our audiences at a free pre-concert *Artist Recital* during our *Summer Festival*.

SCHOLARSHIP STUDENT AND COMMUNITY TICKETS

SCMS provided 125 free Festival concert tickets to music students with partnering schools and institutions, and to local community non-profits that serve disadvantaged populations, including: VetTix, Path with Art, Youth Care, and Tukwila Kids Make Music. For many, this was their first time to hear world-class chamber music performed at Benaroya Hall.

MASTER CLASSES

SCMS provided more opportunities for young musicians to train with Festival artists with 5 free Master Classes that served 115 music students with University of Washington, Seattle Youth Symphony Orchestra, Bellevue Youth Symphony Orchestra, Key to Change, and Chamber Music Madness Tuned In! Summer Camp.

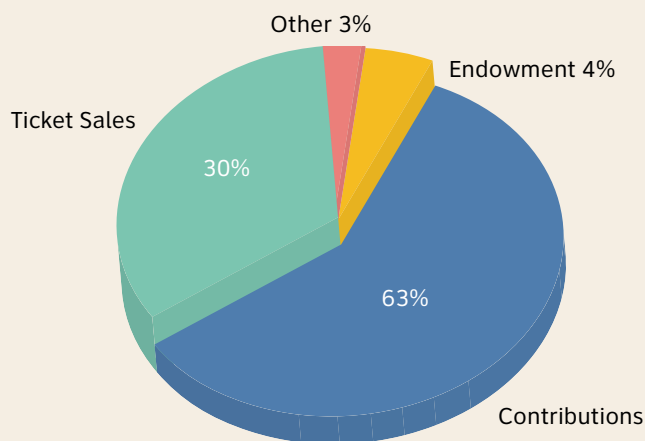

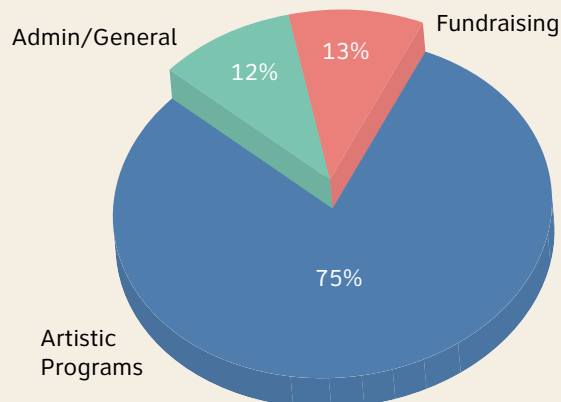
